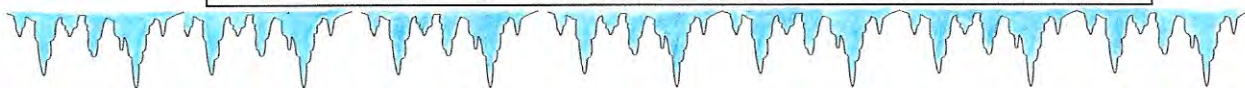

NEW PROGRAM CYCLES A PLENTY

This January 2010, each of Horizons' three gender specific programs begins a new cycle. Throughout the next 6 months, Young Women Arise will train and empower 8 females in the field of peer counseling; Females Against Violence will educate 10 women about domestic violence and routes to healthy relationships; Young Men Against Violence will promote gender equality and respect amongst 8 young males.

In addition to individual programming, participants from all 3 gender-specific groups will attend a monthly support group focusing on community organizing, leadership, and fundraising for the collective.

Each program coordinator [YWAP Jackie Balingit, FAV Deborah Gallegos, and YMAV Luis 'xago' Juarez] adopts a unique curriculum based on personal interest and points of expertise. For example, Jackie uses healing and self-care as a focal point for programming, while Xago uses theater as an outlet for expression. There is no doubt that young women and men growing up in San Francisco are fortunate to have access to gender-specific support like this.



ONE MISSION PEACE MARCH

January 28th marked a momentous occasion in neighborhood unity as Mission District activists marched in solidarity for peace amongst their community. The rally was predominantly organized by the Mission Community Peace Collaborative, an Affinity Group of the Mission Community Council, and a team composed of over 25 Mission District community-based organizations (CBOs).

The march, the second of its kind in the past three months, was organized to achieve the following: 1) To send a message of love to our youth; 2) To highlight the violence prevention work of CBOs; 3) To fight back against budget cuts imposed on youth services due to the citywide deficit. The DJ Project

Audio Production classes closed out their Winter Cycle this past January 29th. The [Monday, Tuesday, and Friday] Introduction class familiarized participants with music history, theory, and engineering techniques as foundation for future recordings. Instructor Korise Jubert guided youth toward the production of 3 Public Service Announcements for the Project Prevention CD, an album addressing accessibility, exposure, and The WHY behind teenage alcohol and drug use.

The [Wednesday and Thursday] Intermediate and Advanced Audio Production classes produced Soul Sample Tribute under the same expertise of Instructor Korise. This project honors legendary soul artists like Teddy Pendergrass and James Brown on 11 tracks co-produced by Korise A.K.A. BigTunes and Tony Jazzo. Trafkintu is our newest off-site treatment group led by Mental Health Specialist Intern Francisca Lizana. This semi-weekly art therapy group is the first of it's kind held at The Latino Commission, our residential treatment partner organization in South San Francisco.

Trafkintu is a Mapuche word meaning *Exchange of Presents*; the word is commonly used in the South American marketplaces to describe the ceremonious seed exchanges between townswomen. Trankintu is analogous of the gift that each participant brings to the table and the meaning it bestows upon the group as a whole.
